Can you believe ---

how fast the years go by.... This is year ten of the Sail, Power & Steam Museum. Just 10 years ago Meg & I (at 75 yrs) flunked retirement and jumped right off the deep end of the business world just as the economy went south (2007). It has been a struggle but we feel we have almost succeeded in making this a very viable museum. The façade of our door yard is graced with a magnificent 65' two masted schooner called *GEM* which is, of course, *Meg* spelled backward. The schooner was a donation by

Tom Thompson about 4 years ago. We took her out of the bay and dug berth six feet deep in the side yard and planted her with her bow riz up just enough to



look saucy and able. We hope in the future to use her for training youth in the ways of a sailing ship. Almost every day a new donation comes through the door. Then my friend Dave Westphal, a boat builder and marina operator in Key Largo, donated a magnificent 30'steam launch, complete including a wood burning boiler and 10 key calliope! How could I turn that

down. We have Sail Power & Steam Museum emblazoned boldly on the topsides and we show it off in all the



local parades. She is a real head-turner. Our good friend Duane Muzzy, an excellent model maker in Florida has made several exquisite to scale models for us to display. The first was our Friendship Sloop "Blackjack" in a case and so perfect we could consult it for reference when we went to restore the real one. Next was an incredible

model of the Lavinia M. Snow, three masts, fully rigged. She was built by the Snow family in 1891 and had a long and exciting career until lost on Hatteras in 1930.

FINEST KIND--OVER THE BAR....

A moment of remembrance for Captain Richard Spear, a grand skipper and good friend of the museum. Special kudo's for a sterling individual who I admired and



loved as I would my brother- Captain Orvil Young. He was not just my best pal, but my mentor and business partner for over a quarter of a century and, we never had a signed piece of paper- that man's hand-shake and that man's word was more binding than a notarized certificate. Orvil was a true Down-East gentleman! None finer, I feel truly privileged to have had his friendship over fifty five adventuresome years. RIP old friend.



Rockland's greatest launching for the last 100 years was on Saturday, July 7. An estimated 500 spectators watched as the 118 year old Friendship Sloop "Blackjack", oldest surviving Morse built sloop in the world was dragged to the launch site by a team of four lively, straining oxen, lured on by 14 Belfast fiddlers and driven by Paul & Cindy Cox, magnificent farmers that have used these animals on the farm exclusively until just 5 years ago when they bought their first tractor! My wife, Meg rechristened the vessel to the drown of the bagpiper, Capt. Ken Barnes, we loaded 1500 lbs. of lead for ballast and took her for a sail across the harbor. This little boat doesn't realize she is only 33' on deck. She acts and tacks like a 50' racing yacht. She gibes, drives and thrives on it. She has a mesmerizing tiller and is sure footed as a dog running on a stony beach. Old Wilbur Morse surely knew what he was doing. You've got to try her.
